Central Cariboo Arts and Culture Grants Awarded

Williams Lake, BC – The Cariboo Regional District, City of Williams Lake and Central Cariboo Arts and Culture Society (CCACS) are pleased to announce the recipients of the 2022 Fall CCACS Grants Program. Grants are available twice annually for non-profit organizations or community groups in Williams Lake and the Central Cariboo (CRD Areas D, E, and F) to support and develop arts and culture within the region.

The Cariboo Regional District and the City of Williams Lake provide funding for these grants through the [Central Cariboo Arts and Culture function](#). A total of \$20,000 in funding is available for both 2022's Spring and Fall intakes, with \$9,000 being recently awarded in this fall intake.
